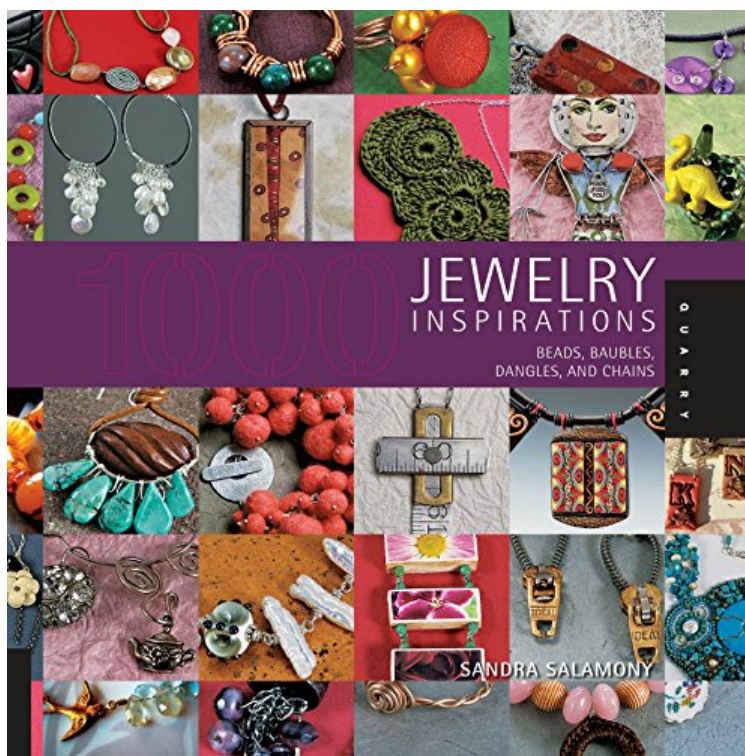

This is for inspiration and it does that. Who wants to wear the exact same thing as everyone else anyways? Not me....I'm unique and like to keep it that way--all my work is UNIQUE as well. I do recommend this especially if you are having some sort of "block" :)
