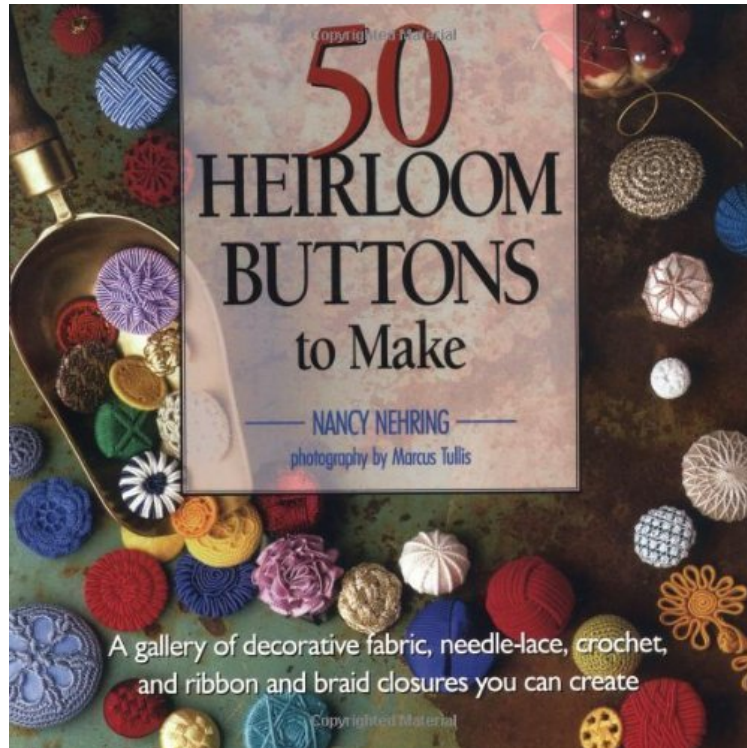

The set-up is a little cumbersome, but that is based on the ability to change type size. You can have one OR the other, but not both. This book had all the information I needed to make these and many other versions of threaded buttons. While at first I found it necessary to flip between different sections of the book to see the illustrations to which the instructions referred, the instructions were clear and easy to follow. After some practice I was very successful at making several button that now adorn my cushions.
