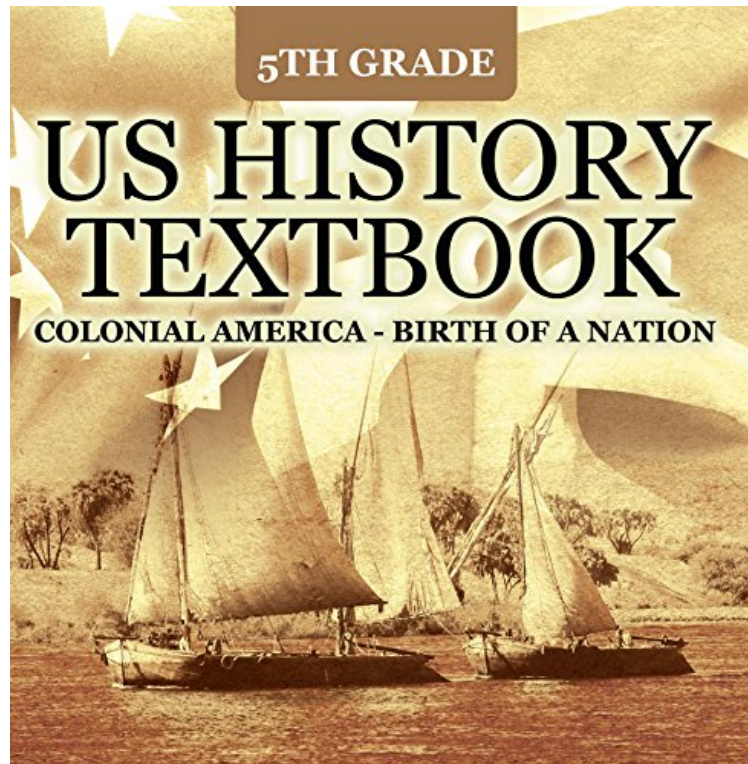


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## 5th Grade US History Textbook: Colonial America - Birth of A Nation: Fifth Grade Books US Colonial Period (Children's American Revolution History)
