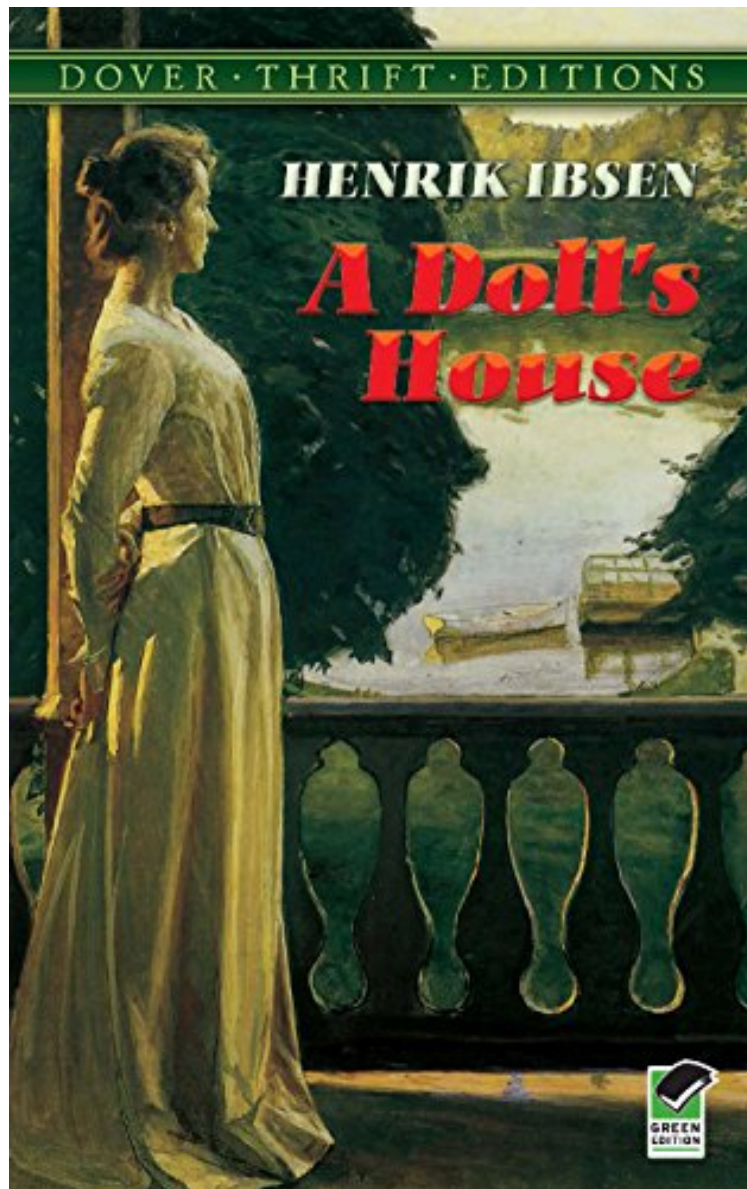

of a woman who finds herself, and that Ibsen has managed to describe the roles that women played in society of that time.
