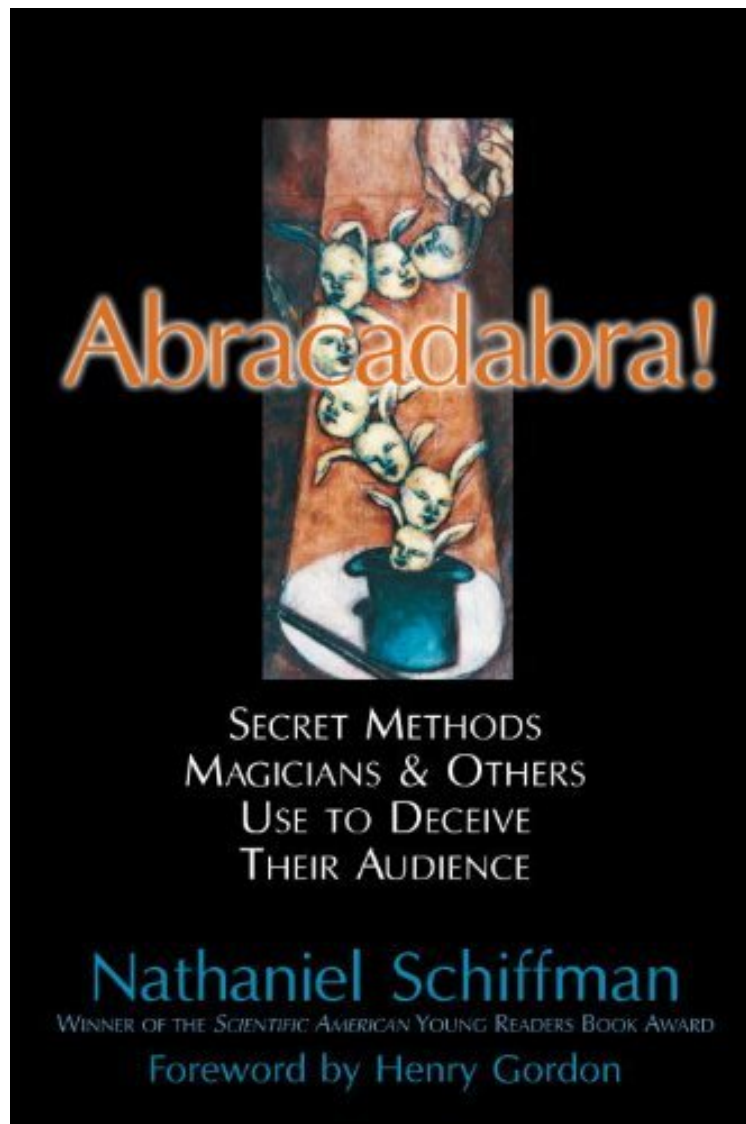

Also explored in detail is the world of off-stage magic.
