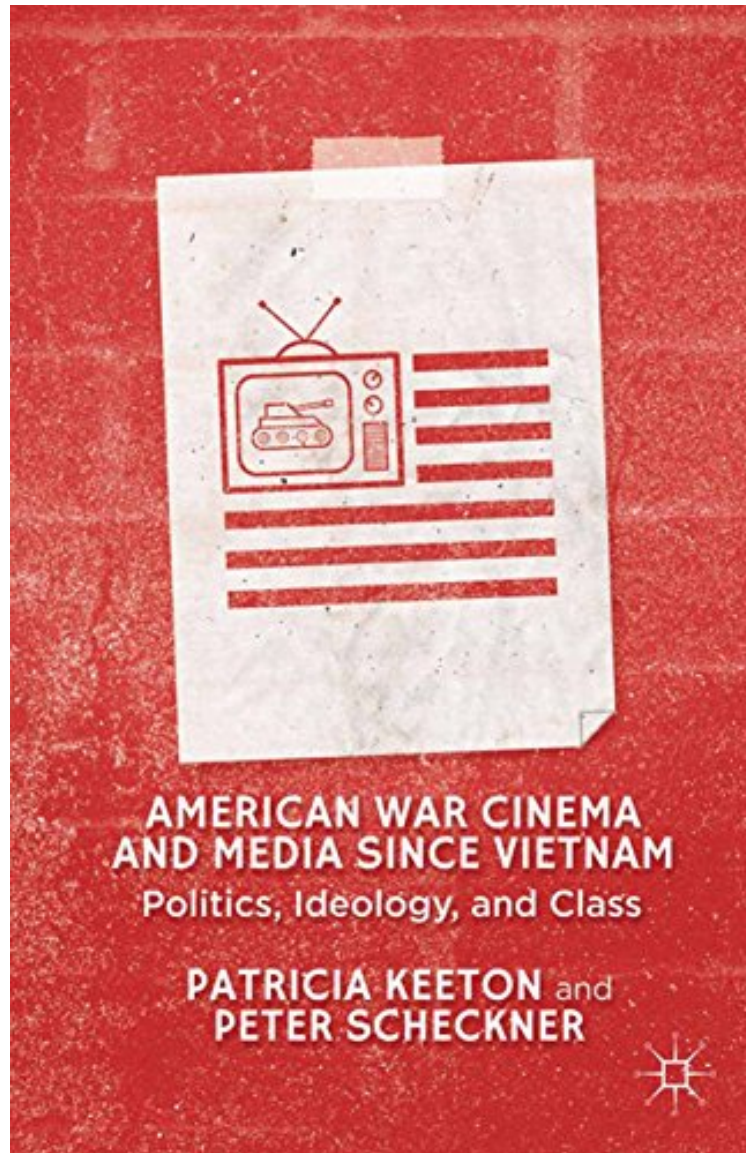


American War Cinema and Media since Vietnam: Politics, Ideology, and Class
