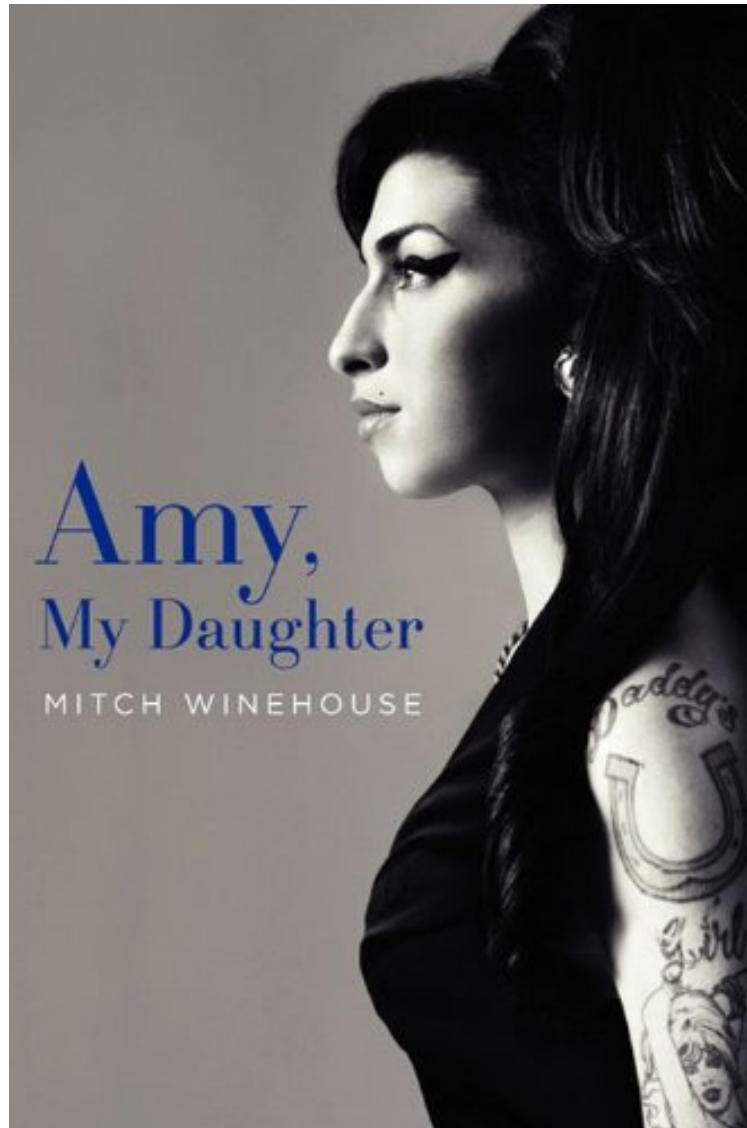

This was not a bad book. It felt like a straightforward, well-written account of Amy's life from her father's point of view, and you can't really ask anything more than that from the book, the story, or the author. The book was well-written; grammar, flow, and so on, were all fine. But the book really slowed down and dragged in the middle part (40-60%?), where the narrative completely stalled out with endless loops of drugs, rehab, promises, relapses, messed up gigs, short cleanups, then back to the lies, drugs, drinking, rehabs, ... every page told the same story over and over and over again. It was awful to read, but I imagined at the time it would have been infinitely worse to live out. So as a book representation of what life was like (going round and round), I think the book communicated the endless loops feeling to the reader (intentional or not). I would recommend the book to Amy fans or those who want to know more about her life.
