

I found just one problem: it should have exercises of words based on groups of letters: ascenders, descenders, horizontal, left/right ellipse, etc. The author limits to show how to write each letter, lower/upper case, a few phrases to train, and that's all on the practice side. On that matter, it is way better Lloyd Reynold's Italic Lettering Handwriting (Exercise Book). The 'bright side' of the book: Author explains in detail the background of Italic Calligraphy, spacing of the italic hand in a simple understandable way, shows exactly how to 'write' each letter, lower/upper case, goes deep in letter

flourishing and even has a chapter for informal italic writing.
