

A bit dryball at times but that's okay because this guy knows his stuff and Bach is worth it. Forget those other books on "music appreciation" - this is the real deal! I supplement it by reading the Wikipedia entries on terms used by the author. It's like figuring out a fascinating puzzle. My only recommendation would be to combine this in a single volume (or read it on a large screen kindle or iPad).
