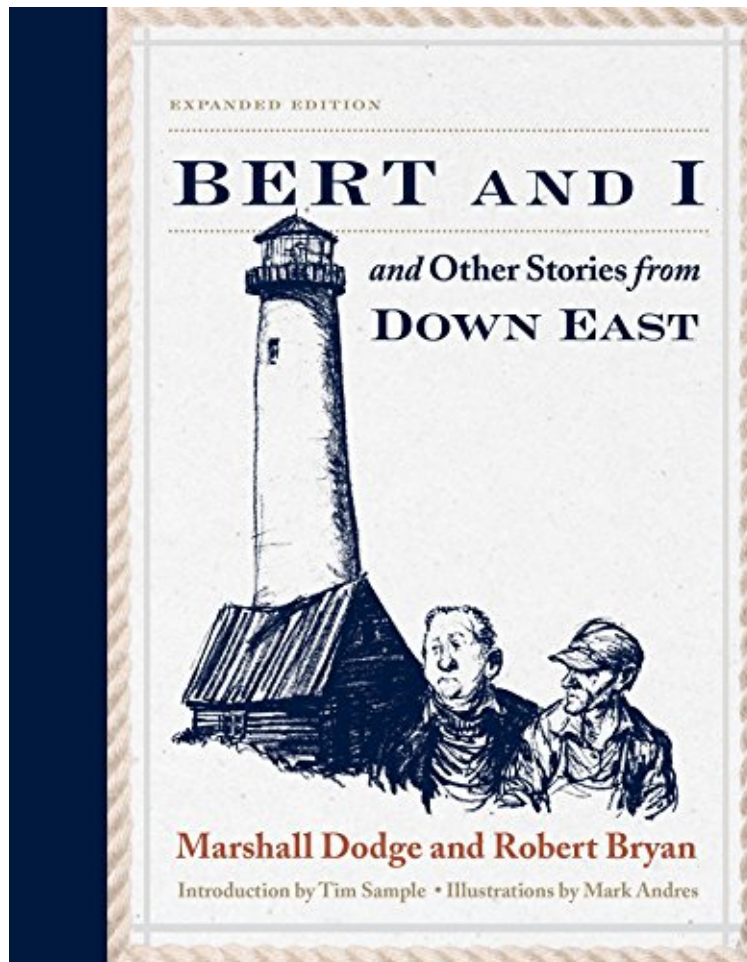

About the Author Marshall Dodge lectured and performed throughout the country and appeared in several PBS productions, including *A Fresh Breeze Down East* and *In the Kitchen*. Dodge started the Maine Festival of the Arts in 1976, and in 1982 he was killed in a hit-and-run car accident. An Episcopal minister and bush pilot, Robert Bryan founded the Quebec-Labrador Foundation, which for going on fifty years has conducted programs in education, community service, and environmental resource management in northern Maine and eastern Canada. Bryan lives in Quebec and Ipswich, Massachusetts, and is currently at work on a memoir, *Turn With the Sun*, about his work as a minister and his more than 12,000 hours as a bush pilot.
