

The photos are great and the historical background is rich and complete. It takes the reader from the earliest days of settlement by the Czechs and moves us up to the present time when we find Berwyn is largely Hispanic. The reasons why are briefly explained. The book is well-organized and easy to read. I loved seeing all the photos of my old town, but wish the author would have put more focus on pictures of the area around the west side of Berwyn, around Cermak and Oak Park Avenue. I wanted to see photos of Tuma's and Presto and Andes Candies and Bud's card shop and the old Chinese restaurant. Maybe even Seneca Restaurant. Also missing are photos of Art's Toys and Two Sisters dress shop and Imperial Camera. There was a great old park with a fountain and pond at Oak Park Avenue and Riverside Drive that might have been included also. But again it is just not possible to include everything and no claim is made

that this little book is a complete encyclopedia. It does a good job of bringing back memories and it is fun to see old streetcars and such.
